264 projects

TSP success story:

One project achieved a breakthrough in the design and production of 3D-printed medical implants, which could lead to improvements in the health and wellbeing of Jordanians, as well as refugees who live in Jordan. The implants are fully customised for the user, stronger and harder than off-the-shelf products and 10% cheaper than those produced in Europe. They can also be produced in Jordan, contributing to the local healthcare manufacturing industry.
